

As players advance through a minor hockey career, they'll have the unique opportunity to play alongside familiar faces, including classmates and local peers, fostering a truly supportive and connected experience. Playing with an Athletic Club also helps players attend the school of choice while still pursuing other hobbies, talents, and academic interests. Many players enhance their skills through daytime skill academies provided by some of Edmonton's top schools. These academy programs offer a substantial increase in dedicated development time (on-ice and off-ice) for each player and permit these players to earn academic credits for playing the sport they love.

PARTNERSHIP WITH CITY OF EDMONTON

Hockey Edmonton's formalized partnership with the City of Edmonton, primarily through annual license agreements, is crucial for securing and managing arena ice time, a process influenced by the Arena Users Advisory Committee. This collaboration ensures Hockey Edmonton benefits from equitable access to facilities, often at reduced rates, enabling them to effectively deliver comprehensive minor hockey programs to almost 10,000 players and support the overall development of hockey in the community.

PROVINCIAL & NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP PATHWAYS

Choosing the AEHL offers aspiring hockey players a clear pathway to compete for provincial championships across all levels, from U11 AA to U18 AAA, providing structured development and challenging competition. Athletes develop their skills within a league designed to foster growth, culminating in exciting playoff series at each age division. Ultimately, success in the AEHL, particularly at the U18 AAA level, can lead to the unparalleled opportunity to contend for the prestigious national TELUS Cup, showcasing talent on a national stage.

This includes essential certifications like the NCCP High Performance 1 program for head coaches at AAA levels, guaranteeing in-depth knowledge of player development, advanced strategy, and ethical coaching practices. Many Athletic Club coaches also bring significant playing or coaching experience from higher levels, providing invaluable mentorship.





THE SANCTIONED HOCKEY ADVANTAGE

Sanctioned hockey provides specific benefits including comprehensive insurance coverage, standardized rules for player safety, certified coaches and officials with background checks, clear pathways for player promotion/affiliation to higher levels, and formal processes for addressing maltreatment and abuse.

While non-sanctioned hockey might offer more flexibility or niche opportunities, it generally comes with a significant trade-off in terms of established safeguards, comprehensive insurance, and formalized development pathways.

RESOURCES AND SUPPORT FOR PLAYERS

The AEHL supports its athletes through comprehensive resources including partnerships with FloHockey and Hudl/InStat Sport for **advanced video** analysis and scout exposure, and a Scholarship Program that has awarded over \$500,000 to more than 300 U18 AAA players for post-secondary education. Additionally, players receive Hockey Canada insurance coverage, benefit from a holistic development approach focusing on on-ice, mental, and physical skills, and are assured a safe environment with strict policies against maltreatment.
